Lead students to the Lena Meijer Children's Garden. Stop at each sculpture shown and read the information, questions, and instructions for activities. Have fun!



MARSHALL FREDERICKS, *TWO BEARS*

This sculpture is called *Two Bears* by artist Marshall Fredericks. Take a look at these two bears. Find a partner and make this pose together. These two bears represent a large brown bear and a small black bear, two types of bears that do not usually see each other in the wild.

- Do you think they are friends?
- How can you tell?



STUART PADNOS, *MULTI-COLORED RINGS*

Stuart Padnos made this sculpture called *Multi-Colored Rings*. It is a sculpture that uses recycled pieces of HUGE machines!

- What shapes do you see?
- What colors do you see?
- Can you make a circle with your hands?
- Can you make a circle with your arms?



VICTOR ISSA, *GRANDPA THE STORYTELLER*

Here is a grandpa telling a story to his grandchild. It is made by artist Victor Issa and is called *Grandpa the Storyteller*.

- What story do you think he is telling?
- If you were to tell a story, what would the title of your story be?



**BILL AND MARY BUCHEN,
*TABLE DRUM AND TALKING DRUMS***

These two groups of drums are made by Bill and Mary Buchen. These sculptures are titled *Table Drum* and *Talking Drums*. They are inspired by different types of drums from around the world. Try making a rhythm by hitting the same spot on the drums at the same pace!

- Each drum will make a different sound. Which drum makes your favorite sound?



LEONARD STRECKFUS, *FAMILY OF WOLVES*

An artist named Leonard Streckfus made this sculpture called *Family of Wolves*. It is made of recycled materials.

- What parts of the sculpture look like something you know?
- How does this sculpture make you think of family?
- Which wolf do you like the most?
- What do you like about it?
- Can you make your body look like that wolf?
